Preamble

As a part of Awareness Program, the team conducted a "Traffic Awareness Drive" in association with Bangalore Traffic Police Department, Peenya Police Station, Bangalore. This was done as it is essential to follow the traffic rules. The saying 'It is better to be Mr. Late than Late Mr.' actually makes more sense when seen through the eyes of the traffic controlling department. The number of traumatic patients has increased substantially in our country. So, are the cases of mortality due to accidents.

Objectives

- To create traffic awareness among the general public for safety on roads (Both for vehicle users and pedestrians)
- To curb environment pollution caused by vehicular traffic

Planning

An instruction class to our students was conducted before the drive by Mr. Dharmappa, Traffic Inspector, Peenya Traffic Police Station along with his associates Mr. Lokesh and Mr. Krishna Das, Traffic Awareness Officers at RUAS, Peenya campus. The instruction class was followed by a formal meet of the traffic officers with FET Dean, Associate Dean UG, Academic Registrar and HoD, Department of Civil Engineering.


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Resources required and procurement

Resources required were placards and posters. These were prepared by the students before the activity. They portrayed the importance of travelling slow, wearing helmet, wearing seatbelts, and using public transport. The placards and posters summarised the agenda using phrases, metaphors, and idioms.

Implementation

The students later carried out a rally holding informative placards and posters, narrating slogans for traffic safety from TVS Cross, Peenya to Jalahalli Cross. Students later displayed the placards and educated the public towards do's and don'ts for safety on roads (Both for vehicle users and pedestrians) and curbing environment pollution caused by vehicular traffic. All the activities were carried out as a team along with the following staff members deputed from the Department of Civil Engineering and under supervision of the HoD Dr. Rajashekar Swamy.

Obstacles and how it was overcome

Making people aware of the situation and understand them the significance was difficult. Communication in Kannada was difficult for some students. Members who knew Kannada translated the speech. This hindered at the beginning, but the public realised this communication barrier and relieved it by asking their friends who knew English to translate the message. This put forth an effective discussion and inscribed the rules into everyone's mind.


Feedback

The RUAS traffic awareness programme was well accepted, and the Traffic Police Team appreciated the RUAS community for the society-oriented awareness programme. They described the number of accidents they deal with everyday and were fed up trying to teach the citizens to follow traffic regulations. The impact on the environment was the prime focus and this led to advising everyone to use public transport or walk if the destination is nearby. The oxygen we breathe now would not remain the same after a few years due to pollution by the combustion of fossil fuels.

Impact Analysis

Many people who were unaware of the rules and regulations could gain information. People were also able to understand the significance of curbing the environmental pollution. The traffic rules emphasized allowed the passengers to reach home safe.


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Learnings

- Frequent traffic awareness programmes will help to improve the safety on roads (Both for vehicle users and pedestrians).

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



The group consisted of 4 Faculties and 47 students.

Preamble

Shivagange is a pilgrimage centre near Dobbaspeth in Bengaluru Rural District, India. The place is a tourist spot due to temples and is famous for trekking. As part of the Social Service activity, this location was selected and after contacting the Grama Panchayat, the inputs regarding the requirements for this place was gathered. Based on this, a one-day activity was planned in Shivagange.

Objectives

- The activities planned on Saturday, 1st February 2020 included cleaning and painting the abandoned shelter
- The activities were planned in such a way that the villagers were made aware of the need for keeping the place clean and dump the waste in the designated place
- Requesting the residents to educate the tourists regarding the pollution.

Planning

Students and faculty were divided into different groups. Each group was assigned different duties. Duties include transportation and its planning (route, pickup points, most economical mode of transport, cost), procurement of materials for carrying out cleaning work, food, planning of activities and sub-activities with proper timing, first-aid requirements, procurement of books & stationery items.


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Resources required and procurement

Transportation: As public transport is available to Shivagange, the team utilized this option.

Cleaning materials: cleaning materials such as broom, buckets, mugs, painting brushes, gloves, masks etc. were purchased for the purpose.

Food: Planned in the temple, Refreshments: Bought from the village

Implementation

The students started the cleaning activity in the village around the temple pond. They cleared all the bushes and cleaned the surroundings by collecting all the wastes dumped. Later the bus shelter which was in a deteriorated condition was cleaned thoroughly and painted afresh. The villagers were also made aware of the necessity to keep the surroundings clean and requested them to dump waste only in designated bins.

Obstacles and how it was overcome

Making people aware of the necessity of cleanliness and how it improves the was difficult. Communication in Kannada was difficult for some students. Members who knew Kannada translated. Luckily, the villagers were co-operative and were willing to listen to the ideas and help the students implement them. The villagers expressed their difficulties with the number of tourists visiting their home-ground. They were not sceptical regarding the visit but were annoyed by the waste they dump on the roads and the drains knowingly.

Feedback

The RUAS awareness programme was well accepted by the villagers and was appreciated by the local Panchayat People. It instilled the importance of keeping the cities clean. Shivagange being a tourist spot is usually worse affected by pollution, therefore cleaning the area conveys a good message to the tourists to keep the place clean. This preserves the divinity and ambience of the place. Educating the villagers with these ideas could allow them to apply the same in the future. It is a combined responsibility of the residents and the tourists to maintain cleanliness.

Impact Analysis

The villagers were happy the way in which the faculty and students of RUAS worked for achieving the requirements of the area. They also expect us to continue our help and valuable advice in future. Collection of proper requirements for adopting villages is one suggestion for improvement. The representatives of the villages must take necessary actions to educate the upcoming generations of the village to continue keeping the city clean.

Maintaining the same soothing environment would improve the tourism of the place and thereby increasing the economy of the place. Tourists must be warned regarding polluting the area as it is their responsibility as well to keep the place neat and tidy.

Learnings

- Frequent traffic awareness programmes will help to improve the safety on roads (Both for vehicle users and pedestrians).
- The need to keep the surroundings clean to avoid pollution and adverse effects to the environment.
- Being responsible citizens at tourist spots.



Report

Preamble

This activity was conducted at Shastri School for Deaf and Dumb Children located at Mahalakshmi Layout, Bangalore with an objective to engage young children in various types of activities, tap into their talents and make them feel appreciated and wanted. Shastri school for deaf and dumb was started in the year 1994 with a mission to provide education to deaf and dumb children at free of cost. The school takes care of 30 orphan, deaf & dumb children in their hostel assuming complete responsibility to meet their basic needs of education, food and shelter. More than 90 students are provided with free education. Students of this team lived, loved and nurtured the children for a day and it was a mutually fulfilling and enriching experience for both RUAS as well as Shastri school.

Objectives

- To engage children in creative activities
- To learn about differentially abled children and their needs
- To provide them support with special consideration

Planning

To better understand the environment, the team would be engaging in, an initial visit was conducted, and a meeting was held between the RUAS team and school authorities. In this meeting, the timelines, and activities to be conducted were decided. In a second follow up visit the RUAS team along with two student representatives finalized the schedule with the school authorities. Once the team returned to RUAS, several student faculty meetings were conducted at Peenya, and the final list of activities was finalized. The planned activities

included designing of inspirational posters and cake cutting was planned to spread positivity among students. Further, activities related to leveraging the creative skills of the children included Fun activities like book balancing, bursting the balloon, puzzle solving, musical chair and craft work were planned.

Resources required and procurement

Resources required were

- Rice packets, oil can and dal as donation to support the school authorities for their day-to-day needs
- Chocolates, books, pen box, cake, colour papers for craft work and some gifts for kids for the activities planned

These were procured before we left from Bangalore.

Implementation

All the students and faculty members assembled at RUAS, Peenya campus on 8th February 2020 at 8.30 am. Students and faculty members used their own vehicles to reach from campus to the school. School authorities welcomed all the team members and introduced their students. The team handed over the donation items such as rice packets, oil can and dal to the authorities. The whole team along with students and teachers at the school assembled in their auditorium. Most of the students were both deaf and dumb. So, the activities were planned in such a way that to entertain the kids to the maximum. Initially the designed inspirational posters were stuck on the wall. Then, a cake was made to cut by some school kids and distributed to all the kids, which created a joyful and happy atmosphere. Fun activities like book balancing, bursting the balloon, puzzle solving, musical chair and craft work was arranged to make the kids involve in the activity and prizes were distributed for each kid. Before bidding a final goodbye, the super talented school kids showcased their talent by dancing. The photographs of activities conducted at the school are shown in Figure 1.

Obstacles and how it was overcome

To spend maximum amount allotted from college on donation items, the commutation of team members was a challenge. To overcome this, students and faculty members agreed to use their own vehicle. Most of the students were deaf and dumb, so communicating with them was a difficult task. With the immense support of the school authorities, the team member could do it well and received overwhelming response from the students.


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Feedback

The RUAS Awareness programme was well accepted and the school wants the team back next year and the team is also interested to go back there next year. The faculty members are still in touch with the school management.

Impact Analysis

The impact of the programme left the children at the school very happy and increased their self-esteem. The programme also resulted in RUAS members being left with a sense of accomplishment of tasks related to improvement to society. The program has demonstrated and enhanced leadership potential of RUAS members including staff and students

Learnings

Children at the school are quite talented. They are showcasing their talent through drawing, dancing, and writing which was very impressive and left most of the team members astonished. All RUAS students have shown leadership qualities.



